## Reducing the effects of crime

Here in Highfields we are blessed to be a caring, close knit and friendly community but, unfortunately, we too are affected by crime.

House-breaking is one of the most common crimes and mostly appear to be

crimes of opportunity with criminals entering through an open or unlocked door.

It is not always necessary to spend lots of money on securing your home.

●Lock all doors and windows when you leave the house.

●Get to know your neighbours.

●Exchange telephone numbers and keep an eye on each other's homes.

●Observant neighbours can decrease prowling, loitering and burglary by reporting suspicious people or vehicles to police.

●If you must leave a house key, avoid leaving it in an obvious location such as a pot plant or under the door mat.

●Keeping valuables out of sight and out of easy reach

●Avoid leaving notes on your door for friends and family informing you are not home - they might not be the only one to see it.

●Ensure your house number is clearly visible so it can be located easily and quickly in the case of an emergency.

●Know which doors and windows you can use as an exit in an emergency so you can leave quickly and safely.

●In an emergency always ring 000 - use the speed dial of your telephone to record other important numbers.

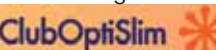

# Staggering impact of barracks closure

## Developer asks community to demand Please Explain from local members

Developer Lauder Pty Ltd is lobbying for rejection of Australian Department of Defence moves to close Cabarlah's Borneo Barracks, home of the Army's 7th signal regiment for more than 60 years.

A report obtained through Freedom of Information by Lauder titled "Socio-Economic Impact for the Rationalisation of Borneo Barracks" shows consideration by the Department of Defence to relocate the barracks to Adelaide, South Australia.

Managing Director of Lauder Pty Ltd Mac Stirling said the economic and social impact on

the entire Toowoomba region would be staggering.

The report outlines the following local impacts:

- Total annual economic losses of \$105.3 million.
- Expected job losses of more than 845.
- Serious short-term downturn in the local housing property market with the simultaneous release of 190 residential properties and 120 rented properties.
- Serious negative effect on small business, particularly at Highfields.
- Serious social impact with

high risk effect to local schools and child care enrolments.

Mr Stirling said, "The Federal Government has been compiling data and reports since 2006, and with a Defence White Paper expected possibly as early as April this year, the region may just lose Borneo Barracks without so much as a please explain from our elected local, state and federal government representatives."

"The closure of KR Castlemaine and resultant loss of 350 jobs, and loss of Southern Cross were two incidences where Toowoomba barely put up a fight to retain our economic and social fabric," he said.

"With the global economic recession hitting all areas hard, the closure of Borneo Barracks cannot be allowed to be seriously contemplated

by government. I doubt the economic advantage for Defence in closing the barracks would be worth the trouble."

Mr Stirling urged residents of Crow's Nest, Highfields, the former Rosalie Shire, Toowoomba and all surrounding areas to start protesting against the potential closure of the barracks and ask their elected State and Federal MPs for a "please explain."

Mr Stirling has forwarded a copy of the Australian Department of Defence report to Member for Toowoomba North Kerry Shine, Member for Toowoomba South Mike Horan, regional mayor Peter Taylor, Cr Bill Cahill, Toowoomba Chamber of Commerce president Shane Charles, and LNP candidate for Toowoomba North Trevor Watts.

## Council monitors carbon pollution

Toowoomba Regional Council officers are collecting data to profile greenhouse gas emissions (or carbon pollution) to understand the carbon footprint of council operations.

Council senior environmental planner Alison Curtis presented the council with a report on the Australian Government's White Paper (Carbon Pollution Reduction Scheme: Australia's Low Pollution Future).

Ms Curtis said the accelerated emission of greenhouse gases was related to global warming impacts, a changing climate and a potential threat to Australia's economy. Increasing concentrations of the major greenhouse gas, carbon dioxide, were being measured globally and locally, in preparation for potential obligatory reporting on carbon pollution.

The Australian Government had three pil-

lars to the nation's climate change policy - reducing Australia's carbon pollution, adapting to unavoidable climate change, and helping to shape a global solution.

It was essential for the regional council to:

- \* Be aware of legislation, obligations and business risk
- \* Show leadership and strategically respond to potential implications on the business or services it provides
- \* Align with national strategy to mitigate or adapt to climate change, and
- \* Plan to prepare for corporate carbon management.

Council officers had attended one of the national information sessions in Brisbane in December.

Officers are to prepare a detailed report for the council.

## Mining company donates house to Fresh Hope

Fresh Hope Association has received a boost in resources with the donation of one of New Acland Coal Pty Ltd's properties in Acland.

Fresh Hope, which provides residential rehabilitation programs for mothers and children dependent on drugs and alcohol, has welcomed the donation of the house.

The donation follows the purchase of a number of properties at Acland in the proposed Stage 3 expansion of its Acland Coal Mine.

General manager, corporate development and government relations Dennis Brown-Kenyon said the company was keen to work with the communities in which it operates.

Although the proposed mine expansion encompasses the town of Acland, NAC explores opportunities for community development.

"When NAC was approached by Fresh Hope to assist in the welfare support services they offer, we saw it as a terrific opportunity to invest in the development of our region," Mr Brown-Kenyon said.

"By donating one of the properties the company has acquired in the Acland area, we are not only able to assist many families in need, we are also able to ensure a piece of the district and its cultural heritage

remains in the region," he said.

The house, originally located in South Street, Acland, was relocated to the Fresh Hope property and renovated by volunteers. Fresh Hope president Ms Mary Jibson said the property now provided a home for on-site counsellors who are required to work closely with women and their families during treatment.

"This allows support staff to be close to the women they are treating, allowing for a family atmosphere where help is at hand 24 hours a day," Ms Jibson said.

"Fresh Hope relies on the generosity of many people, organisations and government funding to provide support services to women in need. NAC's donation has helped us enormously in reaching our goals," she said.

NAC has contributed over \$85,000 worth of donations and sponsorships in the regions in which it operates, with over \$40,000 of this in the Darling Downs region itself.

Other significant contributions for 2008 include the donation of a defibrillator to the Oakey Ambulance Committee, financial assistance for the Oakey District Youth Development Camp and donations to Oakey, Goombungee and Kingsthorpe State schools.



Several times, over the years, he has been a champion Crow Caller and a worm trainer, winning best dressed trainer in 1987.

He is an active Buffalo Lodge member, as well as being in the Oddfellows Lodge. In the former, he served as District Grand Master for 2005-2006.

In August this year, he will have been an active member of the Oddfellows for 45 years.

In 2008, his grandson Brock John was born to John and Jody.

Noel nicknamed him his little time waster, and both of them enjoy sitting outside under the claret ash, watching the leaves blowing in the breeze.

# Hardheads live near deep water

By DONALDA ROGERS

This is a chocolate brown duck between 45 and 60 cm long. It sits low on the water with its tail drooped.

The head and sides of the neck are a deep chestnut. The males are noticeable because they have a fine white ring around the eye, hence their old name "White-eye."

The female is a lighter brown, and has no eye ring. Both have white on the belly and under the tail.

In flight, almost the whole under wing is white with a brown band around the edge. The hardhead is a real water duck in that it likes deep water.

They eat aquatic plants and like mussels which they dive for.



Hardhead nests are hidden in reeds.

They sometimes strip seeds from water plants near the shore.

Their nests are hidden among reeds growing near deep water. The hardhead is

only found in deep water habitats, so you won't find any at Bullocky's Rest. The nearest cousin to the hardhead is the pochard, found in the northern hemisphere.

# Scrub open day

An open day will be held Franke Scrub, Franke Road, off Cawdor Drive, Highfields from 10 a.m. - 1 p.m. on Saturday, March 7.

Franke Scrub is an example of dry rainforest known as semi-evergreen vine thicket. Local people will see what much of Highfields vegetation once looked like.

Many of the plants in the scrub will be labelled with their names for the day.

There will be a stall with these hard-to-get local native species, for those who would like to grow some genuine indigenous plants in their own gardens.

# Thieves hit rural properties

Break-ins at two rural properties have been reported to Crow's Nest police.

Senior Constable Matt Simpson said the properties were at different ends of Emu Creek Road - one nearer the New England Highway, and the other nearer Blackbutt.

Snr Const Simpson said: "Both properties are weekend lifestyle blocks where the owners have had machinery and power tools locked in sheds and shipping containers. A substantial amount of equipment went missing from both.

## CHRISTIAN COMMENT

### Ash Wednesday origins and customs

From Biblical times, sprinkling oneself with ashes has been a mark of sorrow for sin and goes back at least to the time of Job in the Old Testament, probably about 580BC, when Job's Three Friends saw what a state Job was in, 'they tore their robes and sprinkled dust on their heads' (Job 2:12).

In the Western Christian Church, the custom of observing Ash Wednesday, the first day of Lent, may have started as early as c.380AD. Ashes from the burned palms of the preceding year's Palm Sunday are blessed.

With these ashes, the priest marks a cross on the foreheads of the congregation, quoting Genesis 3:19, "Remember, man, that dust thou art, and unto dust thou shalt return".

In the early Church, Lent was a period

of preparation before baptism at the celebration of Easter. It soon became the practice for all Christians to prepare for this festival with a period of feeling and showing sorrow and regret for having done wrong.

This, together with fasting and meeting more frequently for worship and instruction, became a practice that eventually came to be known as Lenten Studies, and have continued in some churches today.

Back in the early days, anyone who had been separated from the 'Body of the Faithful' (also known as the Body of Christ), were, during Lent, reconciled so that together the Church could celebrate the resurrection of Christ in triumph over the power of death and evil.

The Anglican, Roman Catholic and some other Protestant Churches observe Ash Wednesday.

The night is being hosted by the Crow's Nest and District Tourist and Progress Association and will include a multi-draw raffle in aid of the flood and bush fire appeals.

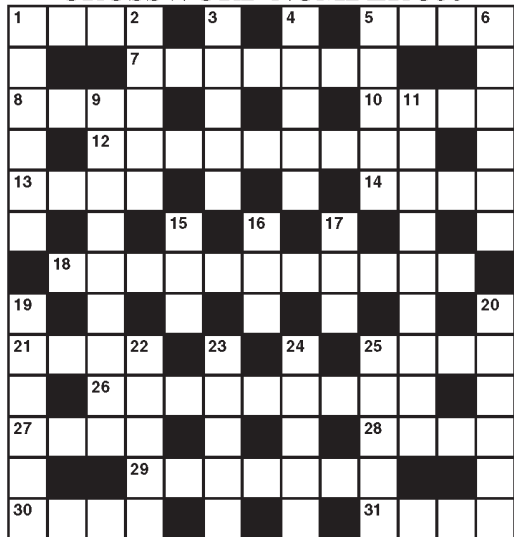
Raffle prizes will include a painting donated by local painter Sandra Dilges and vouchers donated by local businesses.

# Local couple in Victoria bushfire ordeal

"As terrible as it looks on television, you just don't realise the weather conditions they put up with."

"They were just horrendous. I've seen plenty of bushfires in Queensland, but nothing that would even come close to that situation."

Those are the words of Crow's Nest equine veterinary surgeon Peter Allan, speaking of the experiences of himself and his wife Kerrie in the Victorian bushfires.

Mr and Mrs Allan had flown to Victoria to judge at the West Gippsland Stock Horse Show, at Trafalgar, about two hours east of Melbourne. They flew out of Brisbane on the Friday, after ringing the organisers, who advised them that fires in the district seemed to be under control.

Mr Allan said: "We arrived

in Melbourne and we were picked up by the branch president, Ted Walker, who said there had been some changes. The show had been cancelled because tomorrow has been forecast to be extremely hot. There was supposed to be a weather change on the Sunday."

The Allans stayed in a motel at the town of Warrigal that night. On Saturday, Mr Walker drove them south to the coast and the small fishing village of Port Albert.

"While we were having lunch, Ted Walker had a phone call from his wife, a police woman, to say that fires had broken out in the area we had just driven through. All the roads were closed and we wouldn't be able to get back."

However, the small party made a big detour. Mr Allan said: "We looked out of the

window and there was a massive cloud of smoke in the sky. We took a big detour to the town of Warrigal."

At Warrigal, they called in on friends of Mr Walker for a cup of tea. "We were there for half an hour and two other families arrived. They had vacated their own houses because of the fires, and while we were there these burning embers were coming through on the wind."

Warrigal is a town of about 15,000 people, and there had been discussions that it might have to be evacuated. "At that stage the sky was just absolutely black with smoke, and there was this scorching heat on the wind. The Sunday show was cancelled. The Allans planned to catch a plane to leave Victoria."

"Ted Walker's wife, being a police woman, knew all the

roads which were open, and we took a very long detour back to Melbourne. We got on the plane and we were back in Crow's Nest on the Sunday night. We were then confronted by all the TV about how dreadful the fires were. When we were down there, we didn't realise the full extent of the fires."

Later the Allans decided to donate a registered Australian stock horse gelding to be raffled to help members of the Stock Horse Society who had been affected by the Victorian fires. The winner will be drawn at the society's national championships on May 23 at Scone, NSW. Tickets are \$5 each and can be obtained from the society on phone (02) 6545 1122, fax (02) 6545 2165. Mr Allan summed up the experience: "It was a dramatic few days."

### Police target Lauder Dr
