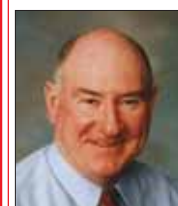

Shine turns down Cabinet post

Member for Toowoomba North Kerry Shine says the swing against him at Highfields was a factor in his decision to refuse a State Cabinet posting. Mr Shine retained his seat in the State election on March 21.

Mr Shine, Attorney-General in the last Cabinet, said the Highfields booth was the biggest one in his electorate.

"The Highfields section has sent me a message that I should be seen more, and perhaps do more, in the electorate itself, rather than take on wider responsibilities as a member of Cabinet," he said.

Mr Shine said his decision to refuse a Cabinet posting had been difficult. His two-and-a-half years as Attorney-General had given him the opportunity to be involved in law reform and the general maintenance of a good legal system in Queensland.

"The Premier was of the view that some change should be made in terms of who should be Attorney-General, but was keen to retain me in Cabinet," he said.

"The election results showed all the Toowoomba booths stayed much the same. The swing there was less than one per cent.

"However, the swing was very marked in Highfields, and put the overall swing at about four per cent."

He believed he needed to do something more in Highfields, although he had achieved results in terms of infrastructure - power supply, schools and roads. "I want to put the Highfields people first and foremost in my consideration. Notwithstanding the appeal of being a Minister, I felt that my duty was to them," he said.

Council amalgamations - likely reason for swing

Kerry Shire said the Darling Downs councils amalgamation was one possible reason for the fall in his vote at Highfields. "Highfields people were very happy with Crow's Nest Shire

Council. People were saying on voting day that amalgamation was the cause. Without detailed analysis,

that's the only explanation I can come up with. I don't believe people would have taken the Borneo Barracks

issue out on me. That's a Federal issue. The same for the Toowoomba bypass.

"The proposed establishment of a brothel in Toowoomba might have been significant at Highfields, I don't know."

Borneo Barracks petition still open

The petition to retain Borneo Barracks at its present site at Cabarlah has attracted 1300 signatures, says principal petitioner Ashley Heckels.

The petition is to be handed to Federal Member for Groom Ian Macfarlane this week, and will be presented to Federal Parliament. Mr Heckels said the petition was signed by people from Highfields, Crow's

Nest and Toowoomba. Highfields Better Business member Kim Cahill said closure of the base would be an economic disaster for the region. The petition officially

closed on Friday, but Mr Heckels said a few more signatures could be added early this week. For further information contact 0439 968 083.

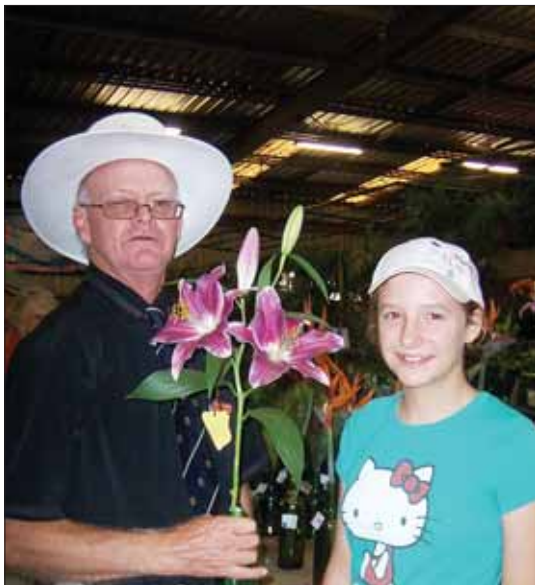

Power disruption

More than 2000 Ergon Energy customers in Highfields had their power supply interrupted on March 19 after a tree fell on high-voltage power lines.

The impact of the tree caused the 11,000-volt powerlines in Kuhls Road to clash, resulting in the network protection system cutting the power supply as a safety precaution at 6.35 p.m.

Crews attended the scene and found the tree had fallen clear of the powerlines and that power could be safely restored. All customers had their power supply back on by 8.12 p.m.

LNP concede Nanango

Sitting Member for Nanango Dorothy Pratt (independent) is retaining a narrow lead in the vote count for her seat.

As at 4 p.m. Thursday, Mrs Pratt had 9768 primary votes, or 40.83 per cent, and her Liberal-National opponent John Bjelke-Petersen had 9717 votes or 40.62 per cent.

On preferences Mrs Pratt had 53 per cent and Mr Bjelke-Petersen 46 per cent.

Postal votes close this Tuesday and the result is expected to be declared later this week.

A spokeswoman for Mrs Pratt's office said it was extremely unlikely that the LNP candidate would win. Mr Bjelke-Petersen had telephoned Mrs Pratt last Tuesday and congratulated her on her win.

Bank of England says UK can't afford more stimulus

Britain cannot afford further stimulus: Bank of England

Wednesday, March 25, 2009: The Bank of England has warned the British Government it cannot afford any further stimulus measures to prop up the sinking economy.

Appearing before the Treasury Select Committee

overnight, Mervyn King, Bank of England Governor said, "I think it would be sensible to be cautious about going further in using discretionary measures to expand the size of those deficits." The Guardian reported.

The British government is due to unveil its next budget on April 22. The government has already implemented a £22 billion (A\$46.4 billion) stimulus package bringing the current deficit for the first 11 months of the fiscal year to a record £75 billion (A\$158 billion.)

Council recycled water backflip disappoints developers

The Toowoomba Regional Council decision to scrap the dual reticulation "purple pipe" system at Highfields has been criticised by developer Jeff Trevarthen.

Mr Trevarthen developed the Trevean Gardens estate in association with John Anderson through the company Trevean Pty Ltd.

He said the dual reticulation system had been installed at Trevean Gardens because it was mandated for future subdivisions in the town plan of the former Crow's Nest Shire Council.

"It's very disappointing that the current regional council has done a backflip on this," Mr Trevarthen said.

"Had we known this was going to happen, we wouldn't have done it. You make a decision based on what you think is the law, and then they reverse their decision."

"There would have been recycled water going into our tanks now. On the figures this would have saved about 40 per cent of household water."

"But it's not just the recycled water. We were approached by the council to do a leading edge subdivision and they took us down to Coomera to see what was happening in subdivision design," Mr Trevarthen said.

He said Trevean Gardens had won a number of environmental awards. It was the first in Australia to receive Urban Development Institute of Australia certification under their EnviroDevelop program.

"We have currently developed 80 allotments at Trevean Gardens. We have a third stage to go, which will be another 40 lots. We're not sure exactly what we're going to do at the moment," he said.

"We had heard whispers several months ago and we asked the mayor and the deputy mayor and two councillors to discuss the issue in November. At that stage this policy change was only a recommendation from the engineers and the purple pipe plan was definitely proceeding."

Highfields Village developer Mac Stirling said his initial response to the policy change had been one of disappointment.

He had received a report on the issue and his company would have the data analysed professionally. "I can't really comment until I have that analysis," Mr Stirling said.

"If the council drops the scheme because it was just too hard, that would be a concern to us. If there are valid reasons, obviously we have to listen to them."

"Dual reticulation was the way we were heading with Crow's Nest council and it all looked rosy. To a degree it would alleviate the pressure on the dams and make the house more independent."

Mr Stirling said he had heard a comment from a council source that bigger rainwater tanks would make people more independent. "That might be all right. But people have to be able to get as much rainwater from their

houses as possible, and that means in-ground tanks, rather than above-ground."

The regional council made its decision after considering a report by water services director Kevin Flanagan.

He said the dual reticulation/purple pipe scheme did not provide a reliable and sustainable disposal option for effluent produced at existing or future stages of the Brownes Road treatment plant.

"The demand on the dual reticulation network will be reduced to zero for extended periods during the year when rainfall will keep underground tanks above 10 per cent volume. Upgrades of the Brownes Road plant will require expensive alternative disposal options," the report continued.

Discontinuation of the scheme would only impact on the 80 householders who had purchased blocks.

"Householders may be disappointed at the loss of a green alternative in water conservation. However, the ability of the system to provide a green alternative is very limited."

"Changes to regulations since the scheme was devised have imposed higher monitoring and compliance costs."

"Together with the operating and maintenance costs of running dual reticulation schemes and the additional costs associated with alternative disposal options during wet weather, this suggests that eventual costs to ratepayers will be less by discontinuing the scheme."

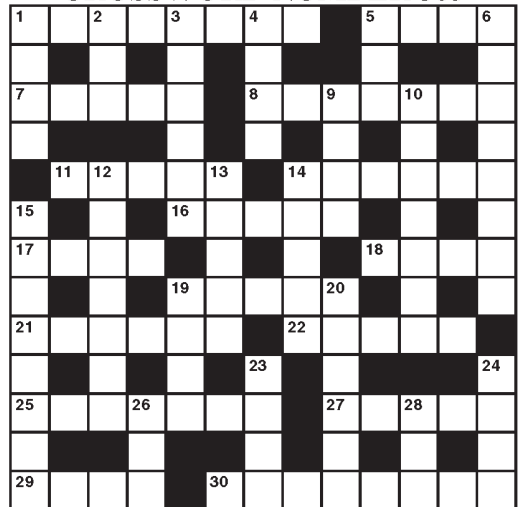
